
I found a second home in Vancouver, and it feels really good to be Canadian too. I have my own business, and we love to travel and spend time with my wonderful family.

We learned to know so many who became, and still are, our friends. We were able to preserve our language and our traditions while "living in" Vancouver.


I am happily retired (wife, mother, and grandmother), and I have been
