Established in 2014 by Prince Harry, The Duke of Sussex, the Invictus Games were created to support the recovery and rehabilitation of wounded service personnel and veterans through sport. Jenny Hultén Hippel and Tommy Gerschman were recently among the 1900 volunteers selected to support over 500 competitors from 20 countries in addition to their accompanying friends & families in the first ever Hybrid (Summer/Winter) Games held in Vancouver and Whistler Feb. 8th-16th. Jenny and Tommy held roles in Guest Services/Swim Officiating and the Medical Team respectively thus directly supported competitors and family members throughout the Games.
